## **PROJECT NOTES**

A popular student venue, the LSU Student Rec Center was damaged in the fall of 2008 by Hurricane Gustav. Repairs included new flooring for a 25,000 SF gymnasium comprised of five side-by-side courts and floor to ceiling divider curtains. The famed "Eye of the Tiger" graphic was installed on the gymnasium floor and now complements the previous floor which was salvaged and preserved as memorabilia to hang in the complex. In addition to an extensive renovation of the interior, an all-copper roof was installed over the entire building. The finished product is a testament to the university's resilience and its dedication to student fitness.
